The learner must achieve 4 mandatory units at Level 2, plus one of two optional units, which can be taken at Level 2 or Level 3, to make a total of 12 credits. There are no equivalent units, exemptions or barred combinations.

- Understand child and young person development
- Understand how to safeguard the well-being of children and young people
- Support children and young people's health and safety
- Engage in personal development in health, social care or children's and young people's settings

### Course Entry Requirements:

This course is aimed at learners not yet employed, as well as providing initial training and induction for those in a voluntary post in primary, secondary or special schools.

Those with no previous formal education will be encouraged and supported.

Learners should be aged 19+ and must be unemployed.
